SCOConnect: Leave Center Feature



CSPS Project Update

The CSPS Procurement Team achieved a major milestone which moves us closer to determining a vendor. Addendum five (5) of the solicitation was released on March 7 and questions from potential bidders were received. Addendums are additions that have been added to the solicitation package. Addendum six (6) updates and bidder questions are currently being addressed.

The Functional Team continues to draft use cases. Use cases describe how a system achieves specific goals and outlines interactions between users and a system. The use cases facilitate communication between technical and business stakeholders.

The Technical Team, in collaboration with the Functional Team, has conducted the first interface workgroup meeting with project partners, the Information Systems Division (ISD), and PPSD. Interfaces are crucial to system development because they enable different software, hardware, and systems to work together seamlessly. The Technical Team is also working with PPSD and California State Universities to address potential data issues and pave the way for a smooth system implementation.

A key milestone was achieved by the Organizational Change Management (OCM) Team. The Stakeholder Connect Liaison Portal is live! Department Liaisons can now interact directly with Agency Change Experts (ACEs) and have access to a comprehensive catalog of resources to help get people ready for the changes ahead. The OCM Readiness Team is also preparing for organizational readiness interviews with their department sponsors and/or Liaisons. Insights from these interviews will shape future OCM strategies.
